- Configure Storage Lifecycle Policies (SLPs) and initiate jobs that use SLPs. • Manage the NetBackup catalog.
- Optimize NetBackup for performance. • Generate NetBackup reports.
- Identify and use resources for troubleshooting NetBackup, including the support information gathering tools related.
